### 杉本博司:无尽的刹那 Hiroshi Sugimoto: Time Machine

杉本博司(1948年出生于东京)以其精妙的大画幅胶片摄影重塑了我们对摄影这一"时间媒介"的认知。 不同于一般意义上摄影对客观事物或决定性瞬间的即时捕捉,杉本博司的拍摄对象是超越肉眼可见的记忆 与永恒。他职业生涯所涉猎的不同领域,以及在日本与北美的工作生活经历,使得其创作实践无法简单地 归入西方当代艺术或日本战后摄影的框架中理解。

1974 年, 杉本博司从洛杉矶的艺术中心设计学院毕业后来到纽约, 开启了他的艺术家生涯。彼时的美国当 代艺术界正值极简主义与观念主义盛行的时期, 唐纳德·贾德和丹·弗莱文等艺术家的作品给杉本博司留下 了深刻的印象。与此同时, 罗伯特·弗兰克、李·弗里德兰德等摄影师颇具人文主义关怀的纪实摄影作为摄 影艺术的重要形式获得了广泛认可。杉本博司敏锐地体察到两条艺术道路在关注对象与思考方式上的差异, 试图结合自身的经验,在当代艺术、摄影技术以及东亚传统美学和思想中寻找调和这些间隙的可能。1976 年, 杉本博司于美国自然历史博物馆开始了"透视画馆"的拍摄。也是从这时候开始, 杉本博司确立了自己对 摄影这一媒介的独特理解:一种有关时间与空间的技术。"时间"成为贯穿杉本博司所有创作的主题—— 对当下、过往与未来的全部思索都凝聚在设定好的曝光时间之中。

"无尽的刹那"是杉本博司在中国的首个机构个展。在中文标题中"无尽"与"刹那"两个与时间相关而 又含义相对的词语,既是对此次展览主题的直接呼应,也是对于艺术家创作和思考中反复出现的对立统一 的理念的诠释——新与旧、东方与西方、刹那与无穷,这些看似对立的概念在杉本博司的创作中来去自如。 本次展览对艺术家自 20 世纪 70 年代至今的视觉艺术实践进行了针对性的回顾。展出的作品既涵盖了杉本 博司包括"剧场""海景""放电场"在内的核心摄影系列的精选之作,同时还呈现了艺术家创作生涯中 少见的彩色摄影"光学"系列,装置作品"反重力结构",以及最新创作的《笔触印象,心经》等。这些 作品展现了摄影作为一种纪实而又虚构的媒介的复杂性,观众亦可以从中体味艺术家对时间和记忆既定理 解的质疑,以及由此展开的富有思辨与趣味性的探索。

Hiroshi Sugimoto (b. 1948, Japan) creates exquisite large-format film photographs that expand our understanding of this time-based medium. Unlike typical photography that captures physical objective things and decisive moments, Sugimoto works with memory and eternity, and other elements beyond what is perceptible to the naked eye. A multidisciplinary practitioner who has long moved between Japan and North America, his unique contribution cannot be simply interpreted using the frameworks of Western contemporary art or Japanese postwar photography.

In 1974, Hiroshi Sugimoto moved to New York and began his career as an artist. During that time, Minimalism and Conceptualism were ascendant, and works by artists such as Donald Judd and Dan Flavin left a strong impression on him. Meanwhile, humanist photography by figures such as Robert Frank and Lee Friedlander had emerged as a key genre in photography and was accepted as contemporary art. Sugimoto was keenly aware of the differences in subject and approach between these two artistic trends, and tried to use his own experience to reconcile advanced art, photographic technique, and East Asian aesthetics. In 1976, Sugimoto began shooting his "Dioramas" series at the American Museum of Natural History, from which one work, Polar Bear, was immediately acquired by the Museum of Modern Art. From then on, Sugimoto has continued to elaborate his unique understanding of photography: a medium inextricable from time and space. "Time" became the theme of his entire oeuvre, in which his thoughts on the past, present, and future are all condensed into a set exposure time. "Hiroshi Sugimoto: Time Machine" is the artist's first institutional solo exhibition in China. It offers a comprehensive survey of his work from the 1970s to the present. The selection features not only works from major series including "Theaters," "Seascapes," and "Lightning Fields," but also lesser known works such as the color series "Opticks," the installation "Anti-gravity Structure," and a new calligraphic creation, *Brush Impression, Heart Sutra*. Taken together, these inquiries into immanent understandings of time and memory demonstrate the potential of photography as an artistic medium that is both documentary and imaginative, sparking curiosity and contemplation.

"Hiroshi Sugimoto: Time Machine" is organized by Hayward Gallery, London, in association with UCCA Center for Contemporary Art, Beijing. Ralph Rugoff, Director at Hayward Gallery, ourated the London presentation, and Neil Zhang, UCCA curator, ourated the Beijing presentation. The exhibition design is by Shinsoken (New Material Research Laboratory), an architectural design firm led by Hiroshi Sugimoto. UCCA thanks the Japan Foundation, Beijing for its special support. 


### 关于艺术家 About the Artist

杉本博司 1948 年出生于日本东京,1970 年于东京立教大学获得经济学与西方哲学双学士学位,后于 1974 年在洛杉矶艺术中心设计学院获得摄影学士学位。目前,杉本博司在纽约和东京两地生活和工作。 他的摄影作品深邃迷人,在国际上广受赞誉。杉本博司的摄影作品曾在全球多个重要机构展出,包括松 涛美术馆(东京,2023)、春日大社美术馆(奈良,2022)、特拉维夫美术馆(以色列,2018)、凡 尔赛宫(巴黎,2018)、比利时皇家美术馆(布鲁塞尔,2018)、日本协会(纽约,2017)、勒科斯特 城堡(法国勒普伊圣雷帕拉德,2017)、雷·雷鲍登戈基金会(意大利都灵,2017)、MOA 美术馆(日 本热海,2017)、加里加伊诺古斯之家、雷科莱托斯展览馆(西班牙巴塞罗那、马德里,2016)以及美 国华盛顿的菲利普斯收藏馆(2015)。他的作品被收藏于大都会艺术博物馆(美国纽约)、日本国立近 代美术馆(东京)、泰特美术馆(英国伦敦)、保罗·盖蒂博物馆(美国洛杉矶,加利福尼亚州)、卡 地亚当代艺术基金会(法国朱伊昂若萨斯)、波士顿美术馆(美国马萨诸塞州)以及加拿大国家美术馆(加 拿大渥太华)。杉本博司还获得过许多著名奖项,包括纽约国家艺术俱乐部摄影荣誉奖章(2018年)、 伦敦皇家摄影学会百年奖章(2017年)、纽约野口勇奖(2014年)、巴黎艺术与文学骑士勋章(2013年)、 东京高松宫殿下纪念世界文化奖(2009年),以及瑞典哥德堡的哈苏基金会国际摄影奖(2001年)。

Hiroshi Sugimoto (b. 1948, Tokyo, Japan) received a B.A. in Economics and Western Philosophy from St. Paul's University in Tokyo in 1970, and a B.F.A. in Photography from Art Center College of Design in Los Angeles. Currently living and working in both New York and Tokyo, Sugimoto has received international acclaim for his enchanting and delicate photographic works. His photographs were exhibited in several major institutions across the globe, including Shoto Museum of Art (Tokyo, Japan, 2023), Kasugataisha Museum (Nara, Japan, 2022), Tel Aviv Museum of Art (Tel Aviv, Israel, 2018), Palace of Versailles (France, 2018), Royal Museum of Fine Arts of Belgium (Brussels, 2018), The Japan Society (New York, 2017), Chateau Le Coste (Le Puy-Sainte-Réparade, France, 2017), Fondazione Re Rebaudengo (Turin, Italy, 2017), MOA Museum of Art (Atami, Japan, 2017), Casa Garriga I Nogués (Barcelona, 2016), Recoletos Exhibition Hall (Madrid, 2016), and The Phillips Collection (Washington D.C., 2015). His works are in collection at the Metropolitan Museum of Art (New York, USA), National Museum of Modern Art (Tokyo, Japan), Tate Modern (London, England), J. Paul Getty Museum (Los Angeles, CA, USA), Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain (Jouy-en-Josas, France), Museum of Fine Arts (Boston, MA, USA), and National Gallery of Canada (Ottawa, Canada). The artist is also the recipient of many notable awards. including the National Arts Club Medal of Honor in Photography (New York, 2018), the Centenary Medal from The Royal Photographic Society (London, 2017), Isamu Noguchi Award (New York, 2014), Officier dans l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres (Paris, 2013), Praemium Imperiale Award (Tokyo, 2009), and the Hasselblad Foundation International Award in Photography (Gothenburg, Sweden, 2001).

The catalogue encompasses select pieces from all of Sugimoto's major photographic series, as well as lesser-known works that fully embody his innovative and conceptually-driven approach to making pictures. Also included in the catalogue are texts by a collection of international artists, scholars, and curators-including James Attlee, Geoffrey Batchen, Allie Biswas, David Chipperfield, Edmund de Waal, Mami Kataoka, Balph Rugoff, Lara Strongman, and Margaret Wertheim-offering thoughtful explorations of Sugimoto's artistic endeavors from a variety of perspectives. Hiroshi Sugimoto: Time Machine is designed by Graphic Thought Facility and published by Hatie Cantz. ### "杉本博司:无尽的刹那"展览系列工作坊 "Hiroshi Sugimoto: Time Machine" Workshop Series

基于本次展览,UCCA Kids设计了一系列儿童艺术工作坊,通过不同主题的课程带领孩 子欣赏杉本博司深遽迷人的摄影作品,并探索艺术家在拍摄动物标本、蜡像、雕塑、建 筑、风景等不同主体时所使用的摄影技术和背后的哲学思考。在工作坊课程中,小朋友 们将学习基础的摄影理论和相机操作方法,并进一步尝试将生活中的抽象概念用摄影的 形式呈现出来。

UCCA Kids has designed a series of art workshops for children to appreciate Hiroshi Sugimoto's profound and captivating photographic works through various themed courses. They can also explore the photographic techniques and philosophical thinking behind the artist's work in capturing subjects such as animal taxidermy, wax figures, sculptures, architecture, and landscapes. In the workshops, children will learn basic theories of photography and methods to operate the camera, and further attempt to present abstract concepts from daily life in the form of photography.
